Aims

This module aims to examine Indonesia as it underwent radical transformation from being a colony to becoming a regional power. It seeks to develop a critical understanding of the intricate processes of nation and state-formation, in addition to the appreciation of the challenges political leaderships have to face in nation-building. The module initially focuses on the crystallization of the concept of 'Indonesia' and Indonesian nationalism in the Netherlands Indies. It sheds light on the growth of Indonesian nationalism, the impact of Japanese occupation and Indonesian Revolution. It then proceeds to examining the Old and New Order eras and end with a discussion of Indonesia in the post-Suharto era.

Learning Outcomes:

On successful completion of this module, a student will be expected to be able to:

Lower order :	30%	 Discuss the historical development of the concept of Indonesia as well as its importance in the growth of the Indonesian nation-state. Clarify the role of nationalism in the development of the Indonesian nation-state.

Compare and contrast the key features of the Old Order, New Order and the post-Suharto periods in Indonesian history. Apply knowledge of the past to explain the lingering challenges in Indonesia
Higher order:	30%	 Evaluate the opposing views on the impact of the 2nd World War on Indonesia as well as on the nature of Indonesian Revolution, the Old Order and the New Order periods in Indonesian history, and be able to formulate an informed opinion on the matter.
