

WELCOME OUR NEWEST FACULTY MEMBERS



With over 37 years in climate science, Professor Dr Fredolin made landmark contributions through pioneering ENSO forecasting, serving as Vice-Chair for IPCC Working Group I, and establishing CORDEX Southeast Asia to advance regional climate modelling. He has shaped academic and policy landscapes as a Full Professor for 15 years at Universiti Kebangsaan Malaysia and later as a Climate Policy Strategist at Bank Negara Malaysia. A Fellow of the Academy of Sciences Malaysia, he has authored over 150 publications, led 30+ research projects, and was awarded the prestigious 2022 Anugerah Akademik Negara for Best Scientific Publication.



Dr Syahwal holds a Bachelor's degree, a Master's degree in Malay Literature, and a Doctor of Philosophy in Malay Literature from Universiti Brunei Darussalam.

Dr Syahwal has received multiple accolades for his creative writing and several awards from Bahana Essay Writing Competitions by the Dewan Bahasa dan Pustaka and the Pangsura Journal Writing Competitions.



Dr Amalina holds a PhD in Social and Behavioural Science, specialising in Tourism, from Universiti Malaya. Her doctoral research focused on the touristification of Brunei's water village. Her passion for tourism was ignited during her Master's program in Anthropology of Travel, Tourism, and Pilgrimage at the School of Oriental and African Studies in London. Dr Amalina is also an alumna of Universiti Brunei Darussalam, where she earned her BA in Sociology-Anthropology.

Dr Hannah, Assistant Professor at the English Studies Programme, became the only local academic from UBD acknowledged as World's Top 2% Scientists 2023, which featured 15 other scholars.

With expertise in Southeast Asian Literature and Diaspora and Globalisation studies, her research interests include Bruneian literature, mental health focusing on representations and Chinese literary discourse in contemporary world.

Collaborating with international academic, Dr Hannah will publish a coedited volume, "Transnational Southeast Asia: Communities, Contestations and Cultures" with Springer in 2025.







SEA JUNCTION GRANT RECIPIENT

Dr Maria Carinnes Alejandria

Dr Alejandria, Assistant Professor at the Sociology and Anthropology Programme, has been awarded the significant grant by the Foundation for Southeast Asia Studies (SEA Junction) for her innovative project, "Empowering Urban Communities: A Resilience Toolkit for Inclusive Disaster Preparedness and Collaborative Hazards Management in Brunei, Indonesia, Malaysia, and the Philippines (BIMP)".

This project is set to revolutionise disaster resilience and preparedness across Southeast Asia.

To date, Dr Alejandria has led numerous research projects related to social health, disaster resilience, and food security that were funded by World Health Organization, Brown University, UNDP, UNAIDS, the Philippine's Department of Science and Technology, and the National Research Council of the Philippines.


Dr Siti Mazidah's primary research interests lie at the intersection of the geographies of young people, digital media and popular culture, and religion.

Professor Dr William Davie, an Eminent Visiting Professor from the University of Louisiana at Lafayette, delivered two engaging seminars at FASS.


In "Chaos and Credibility: Media Challenges in a VUCA World", he discussed the need for media literacy amid global volatility and uncertainty.

His second seminar, "Media Assistance Programs: Sources and Outcomes," focused on funding and training for journalists and highlighted the importance of balancing media support with cultural autonomy.

PROFESSOR WILLEM VAN SCHENDEL

Professor Dr Willem van Schendel, an Emeritus Professor from the University of Amsterdam, facilitated the Graduate Research Colloquium on "Recent Trends and Methodologies in Asian Studies: A View from Anthropology and History", offering our graduate students valuable perspectives.

He also delivered a seminar on "Who Needs 'More-than-Human' Social Science", encouraging innovative approaches to social science research. During his visit, he explored Brunei's National Archive and Institute for Biodiversity and Environmental Research at UBD, deepening his connection with the region's historical and environmental heritage.





Deans from FASS and the School of Creative Industry Management and Performing Arts, Universiti Utara Malaysia, came together in a warm and friendly meeting to discuss future collaborations.

FASS received a courtesy visit from Sunan Gunung Djati State Islamic University Bandung, Indonesia. The visit from the Islamic Communication and Broadcasting Program was led by Dr. Hj Imron Rosyidi.





Academics from the Geography, Environment and Development, and the Sociology and Anthropology programmes shared their expertise with visitors from Tokyo University of Agriculture and Technology (TUAT).

FASS welcomed visitors from NIE Singapore. Dr Amalina led an insightful heritage trail around Kampong Ayer, while Dr Syahwal captivated everyone with his enriching lecture on Bruneian folklore.



FASS ADVANCES SUSTAINABILITY THROUGH RESEARCH AND COLLABORATION

FASS participated in the launch of the Sustainability Initiative by the Ministry of Health, Brunei and the Melayu Islam Beraja (MIB) Day celebration, showcasing its commitment to the Sustainable Development Goals (SDGs). At the Sustainability Initiative, FASS highlighted six collaborative projects and 20 publications (2021-2024) focused on SDG 13 (Climate Action).



Meanwhile, at the MIB Day, FASS exhibited research aligning with SDGs 11 (Sustainable Cities and Communities) and 15 (Life on Land) across seven programmes.

These efforts reflect the faculty's dedication to integrating local values with global sustainability goals. FASS continues to contribute efforts to the SDGs through research, publications, collaborations.



FASS STUDENTS SHINE AT PROFESSOR VICTOR KING PRIZE

Three recent graduates from FASS were recognised at the Professor Victor King Prize in Borneo Studies Prize Giving Session. These students completed their Final Year Projects for the 2022-2023 academic year.

The grand prize was awarded to Mr Danial Hakim bin Haji Sufian (Sociology and Anthropology) for his research titled, 'Beyond the Noise: An Exploration of the Brunei Metal Scene'. He was supervised by Associate Professor Liam C. Kelley. In addition to receiving a monetary award, Mr Danial Hakim's final year project will be published in the Institute of Asian Studies (IAS) Working Paper series.

Two honourable mentions were presented to: Ms Ili Arina binti Zainal (English Studies) for her research 'Urang versus Orang: Investigation into the Frequency of Bruneian Students' Use of Standard Malay', supervised by Dr Paul Deyuan He, and Ms Nur Umairah binti Salleh Imanina (Sociology Anthropology) for her research titled 'From Art Enthusiasts to Nation-Builders: Exploring the Contributions of Artists in Nation-Building', supervised by Dr Muhammad Arafat bin Mohamad.

FASS ACADEMICS AND POSTGRADUATES PARTICIPATE IN BRUNEI FORUM 2024

FASS academic staff, including Mr Gabriel Yit Vui Yong, Dr Siti Mazidah Hj Mohamad, Dr Asmali Sulaiman, and Dr Najib Noorashid, along with postgraduate students, actively engaged in the Brunei Forum 2024, held on 26–27 February at the Senate Room, Chancellor Hall, UBD.

Organised by the Academy of Brunei Studies (APB), the forum, themed "Brunei Today and Over the Next Thirty Years," offered a dynamic platform for discussions on Brunei's present and future, aligning with Wawasan Brunei 2035.





Notable contributions included a special talk by FASS lecturer Gabriel Yit Vui Yong, who presented the "Blue Urbanism Strategy to Climate Adaptation" during a session on Economics and Wawasan.

The forum also featured prominent speakers from academia, business, NGOs, and government, as well as 15 parallel sessions exploring themes such as cultural development, youth, sustainability, and entrepreneurship.

FASS ACADEMICS AT THE NATIONAL TEACHER'S DAY CONFERENCE



FASS academics Dr Najib Noorashid, Dr Mayyer Ling, and Dk Dr Nur Raihan Pg Hj Mohamad presented their research on "Blessings in Disguise': Exploring Motivations, Challenges, and Resilience among Postgraduate Students at Higher Education in Brunei Darussalam" at the Teacher's Day Conference.

The study draws inspiration from the FASS Research Colloquium earlier this year and highlights key insights into the postgraduate experience.



INTRODUCTION OF UN TOURISM INSIGHTS AND TRENDS ON EDUCATION AND SUSTAINABLE TOURISM



FASS together with the United Nations's Tourism and Tourism Development Department from the Ministry of Primary Resources and Tourism hosted a special lecture on the "Introduction of UN Tourism Insights and Trends on Education and Sustainable Tourism".

The lecture was delivered by Mr Harry Hwang and Mr Yang Li, UN representatives and moderated by Dr Shirley Chin from FASS.

FASS INVOLVEMENT AT 19TH ASEAN & 9TH ASEAN + 3 YOUTH CULTURAL FORUM



FASS played a key role in the cultural exchange at the 19th ASEAN & 9th ASEAN+3 Youth Cultural Forum (AYCF 2024), where members of the Dance Culture Club showcased their talent with performances of 'Jipin Laila Sembah', 'Selendang Kipas', and 'Joget Hati Tertawan' during the welcoming night. The performances made for an unforgettable evening, celebrating Bruneian dance traditions.

FASS contributed to the event through various cultural workshops, including theatre, dance, *silat*, and *pantun*, which were organised for international delegates.

These activities played a significant part in the closing ceremony of the AYCF 2024, highlighting the rich cultural heritage of Brunei while fostering closer regional ties through shared experiences.



FASS ACADEMIC ACHIEVEMENTS IN BLUE ECONOMY RESEARCH

In 2024, an academic journey into the "blue economy" marked significant milestones for a Mr Izni Azrein Noor Azalie specialising in development studies. Having begun his career in 2008 with studies on the impact of development on communities, his focus shifted towards blue economy policies, alongside interests in cultural and creative economies and halal industries. This pivot was reinforced through three trips to China, fostering collaboration and advancing regional knowledge-sharing efforts.



The first trip, from 24–30 March 2024, involved participation in the 3rd Training Seminar on Blue Economy Development Capacity-building in Haikou, China. Organised by the China Institute for Reform and Development (CIRD), the programme explored marine resource development through advanced green and blue technologies. Mr Izni Azrein alongside other participants, including policymakers and industrial experts from ASEAN member states, engaged in lectures, industrial site visits, and knowledge-sharing sessions. Topics such as deep-sea cages, blue carbon, and mangrove potentials were discussed with relevance to Brunei's development.



The second trip, from 18–20 May 2024, featured two conferences: the Forum on China-ASEAN Cooperation in Blue Economy and the 2024 RCEP Media and Think Tank Forum. Representing Universiti Brunei Darussalam (UBD), Mr Izni Azrein delivered presentations on Brunei's maritime economic cluster and the role of media in RCEP development. The conferences concluded with commitments to expand the RCEP Think Tank Network.

The final trip, from 23–27 September 2024, included workshops in Xiamen and Beijing, focusing on maritime spatial planning and sustainability. Collaborative efforts resulted in a joint research proposal on marine resource management submitted to China's funding body.



Mr Izni Azrein's year concluded with several papers under review for publication, appointments as research associate with Chinese institutions, and plans for further collaborations in 2025.



SPECTRUM UNVEIL: THE DESIGN AND CREATIVE INDUSTRY GRADUATION EXHIBITION 2024

UBD came alive with creativity and innovation during the Design and Creative Industry Graduation Exhibition, themed Spectrum Unveil. Held at the Right Wing of the Chancellor Hall, the event drew over 1,000 visitors, showcased the immense talent of UBD's graduating cohort, and celebrated their diverse creative accomplishments.

The 8th Pertemuan Sasterawan Brunei (PSB8), themed "Falsafah Negara Melayu Islam Beraja dalam Sastera: Sumbangan Ke Arah Mencapai Wawasan Brunei 2035", featured 16 insightful papers, including a keynote by Yang Berhormat Pehin Datu Seri Maharaja Dato Paduka Seri Setia (Dr) Ustaz Haji Awang Abdul Aziz bin Juned (Adi Rumi) and an opening speech by Professor Ampuan Haji Brahim bin Haji Tengah.

At the PSB8, Dr Maslin, Dr Zefri, and Dr Syahwal also served as panelists, enriching the discussions with their expertise. The two-day event was held at Balai Sarmayuda Dewan Bahasa dan Pustaka, Berakas, Negara Brunei Darussalam.



FOUR UBD STUDENT FILMS SHINE AT MALAYSIA'S LONGEST-RUNNING SHORT FILM FESTIVAL



The 20th Mini Film Festival (MFF) held in Sarawak, Malaysia, featured a special programme titled 'Through Bruneian Eyes: Films that Speak Our Stories', highlighting seven Bruneian short films with four crafted by UBD Design and Creative Industries (DCI) major students.

The featured UBD films include *Iyaan Wears a Hat* by Natasya Jazmeena, *Jasa* by Azhar Khir, *Love's Detour: From Crush to Crash* by Dzul Iskandar, and *Menguyung Masa* by Ridhwan Sabri.



Festival director, Yow Chong Lee lauded the new Borneo Film category for fostering connections among filmmakers from Sarawak, Sabah, Brunei, and Kalimantan. 
