

Women behind the Risk of Climate Changes



FOCAL POINTS TO THE UN FORUM ON FORESTS (UNFF)



Strengthening women's participation in community-based forest governance improves forest resource conservation; however, women who rely on forest resources are often underrepresented in forest governance at the local, national, and international level. Less than a quarter of the 173 Focal Points to the UN Forum on Forests (UNFF)— an intergovernmental forest policy forum—are women. These focal points liaise with the UNFF and member states, assisting in developing and implementing policies and producing country reports. They are therefore in a position to advance gender-responsive forestry policies and programmes.


- 70% of the 1.3 billion people living in conditions of poverty are women. For example, in urban areas, the breadwinner of 40 % of the poorest family are women.
- In the labour force of agricultural sector, 50-80% of workers are women and they only 10% of them hold land ownership
- Political sphere: in general women hold less power in decision making process. So, their contributions in climaterelated planning and other policy making structure are not taken into account.
- In the event of severe weather, (e.g droughts and floods), women perform excessive work more to secure household livelihoods and assets.
- Global literacy among women is low (30% in Global South are illiterate) ---in Africa, the majority of women are still unable to read. When coupled with inaccessibility to resources and decision-making processes, limited mobility places women where they are disproportionately affected by climate change.
- Women, in many developing countries face gender inequalities in regards to health, human rights, proper education, political and economic status, land ownership, housing conditions, exposure to violence, education.
- Climate change will be an added stressor that will aggravate women's vulnerability. It is widely known that during conflict, women face heightened domestic violence, sexual intimidation, human trafficking and rape

- 8 September 2018
- All of the protest activists were women
- The protest event was held virtually and on the spot in Northern American countries, Europe, Asian cities. In total in 95 countries, with 900+ actions
- This protest globally demanded real climate action from their local leaders to reduce eco-collapse on earth
- Despite virtually unified, ideologies are heterogenous: anti-fossil fuel production, endangered animal protection, global forest conservation, indigenous lands, equal rights for women, carbon emissions, ice-melting in Arctic regions.


